
NOTICE FOR ELECTION

TO THE OFFICE OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF ELECTRONICS CITY INDUSTRIES' ASSOCIATION (ELCIA) FOR THE YEAR 2021-2023

- In accordance with the Memorandum of the Association as amended and approved by Registrar of Societies, the Election for the Executive Committee Members of the Association was due by June 2021, on expiry of the term of the present Executive Committee members. In view of the same, Election to the Executive Committee will be held on 17th Aug 2021 (Tuesday). Interested members are requested to file their nomination as per the attached form.
- 2. Election is notified for the position of 15 (Fifteen) Executive Committee Members in addition to immediate Past President and Immediate Past Secretary who stand elected automatically as Executive Committee Members. Please comply the following instructions while submitting the nominations:
 - a) Only one person can be nominated to the Executive Committee by the interested Ordinary Member Industry (Associate members are neither permitted to nominate anybody nor vote during the election)
 - b) The member company nominating the person should have cleared their dues to ELCIA on or before 10th Aug 2021.
 - c) The last date for filing the nomination will be on 13th Aug 2021
 - d) Scrutiny of the nominations will be completed by 14th Aug 2021
 - e) The last date for withdrawal of the nomination will be 16th Aug 2021
- 3. In event of receiving more than 15 nominations, the Executive Committee members will be elected as per the rule 9 of ELCIA Bye Laws on 17th Aug 2021 through secret ballot. If the number of nominations is equal to 15, the committee members will be declared unanimously.

Note:

- a) It is requested that the Companies should nominate a very Senior Member (not below the level of a Senior Manager / Vice President) to take up this responsibility. The presence of the Senior Level People in the Executive Committee will not only make the association stronger but also speed up the decision taking capabilities and efficient functioning.
- b) Companies who have not paid their dues are not eligible for voting.





- 4. The newly elected Executive Committee Members will further elect the Office Bearers as listed below during the first Executive Committee Meeting to be convened at the earliest but not later than 15 (Fifteen) days of the election of the Executive Committee:
 - a) President
 - b) Vice President
 - c) Secretary
 - d) Joint Secretary
 - e) Treasurer

Note:

- i. The criteria for Executive Committee Members to be elected as Office Bearers:
 - a) Should be a member of the newly elected Executive Committee
 - b) To be elected as President or Secretary, he should have been a member of any previous Executive Committee for a minimum period of two years
 - c) Office Bearers can hold the same office consecutively for a maximum of two terms (4 years). To be elected as an Office Bearer again, there should be a minimum break in Office of one year.
- ii. The Nomination Form for the Election to the Executive Committee is enclosed. The duly filled up in all respect should be signed by the CEO / Authorized Signatory of respective industry. Filled up nominations may please be submitted to the office of ELCIA on or before 5.00 pm, 13th Aug 2021. Ms. Rama N.S, Chief Executive Officer, ELCIA will be the Returning Office for election as per the Bye-Laws. President's Message



Friends,

At the outset, I want to thank you all for the great support over these 2 years and giving me the privilege to interact with you today – on the occasion of the 30th AGM of Elcia.

We have launched a new website / portal titled 'Powering Possibilities' that showcases the collective capabilities of businesses in Electronics City to the world enabling businesses world-wide to quickly and easily reach out to our members. Showing the wide spectrum of capabilities available among our members on one platform will not only make it easy for seekers to locate what they need but coupled with the reputation of Electronics City companies and ELCIA will bring credibility to even the small businesses.

Our bigger members are so well established that ELCIA may not be able to (nor are they likely to need) any support on the business front. However, the wonderful work they are doing in terms of community service, employee development, corporate governance and such things are of very high standard and needs to be communicated widely. ELCITA, apart from infrastructure support to enable this has offered generous assistance in the form of providing Subject Matter Experts to advise & support member companies to enhance their capabilities in various fields including Product Development, Intellectual Property Development and Protection, Finance, Business Development, Some of these will be attached to ELCIA Cluster.

ELCIA Cluster has been rendering various services to member companies and others and ELCIA is continuing to financially & administratively support the Cluster CFC on an ongoing basis to enhance its capabilities. To aid Govt., efforts in tackling the pandemic, ELCIA Cluster has commenced producing Oxygen Concentrators with know-how from ISRO and ELCIA has funded the first batch production. Secretary's Report



Dear Members,

It gives me great pleasure to welcome you all to the 30th AGM of the Association. My heartfelt greetings and good wishes to you all.

It is with great pleasure that I provide the Secretary's Report for the year 2020-21. The past year has been an eventful one not only to ELCIA but to the world at large. This committee is completing its 2-year tenure, and I am happy to inform you that we have done our best to sail through this pandemic that has brought the whole world to its knees.

Industries are struggling to make sense of the post-COVID business environment, and many find themselves leading from this grey area of indecision. To meet the challenges posed by the pandemic, businesses around the world had to react in agile and decisive ways. As we move into the next phase, now is the time for businesses to seek out and seize the opportunities emerging in the recovery.

Realizing the opportunities thrown by COVID in terms of Multinationals moving out of China, ELCIA built a new portal to showcase the incredible capabilities of ELCIA's member industries. The portal navigation is such that the companies searching for partners in Electronics City would find it very customer friendly. We request all the member industries to have a look and give your valuable feedback. ELCIA is also planning to conduct an international marketing plan to broadcast the website and there-by provide maximum visibility to the member organizations.

Before providing a brief report on the regular activities of ELCIA, I would like to take this opportunity to inform you that ELCIA joined hands with ELCIA Trust and ELCITA in combating the 2nd wave of COVID. Be assured that ELCIA is your association and is always ready to assist you, be it lobbying with Govt., training the employees, cocreation of products, marketing, sourcing, knowledge sharing, recruitment, and apprenticeship.



Below is a brief of all the activities conducted in the last year.

1. ELCIA verified companies: An accreditation issued to the member companies after verifying specific parameters that would add value/authentication to their marketing efforts.



2. ELCIA Powering Possibilities

Portal: Members of ELCIA have long recognized the need



for a common business portal that emphasizes the organization's multiple capabilities. Under the aegis of ELCIA, this site is aimed to assist businesses in finding mutually fruitful collaborations for a variety of bespoke products and services.

3. Apprenticeship Program: A program that started last year and got a lot of momentum, but unfortunately, COVID 19 had its effect on this program also. We could only place 50 apprentices as compared to the 100+ last year. Yet, we have not accepted the defeat, and we are trying our best to roping the hinterland candidates for the apprenticeship program.



- **4.** Among all these setbacks, ELCIA has the good news to announce. ELCIA was the only association from Bangalore to get selected for the world bank funding under the **Skills Strengthening for Industrial Value Enhancement STRIVE project.** This is a 2-year project, and the funding is for one crore, basically provided to increase apprenticeship intake among the member industries. We are religiously working on the project, and we are sure, as always, under the guidance of project chairman Mr. Vaidyanathan, we will be able to complete the project successfully.
- 5. ELCIA is happy to announce that we are now Chief Minister's Kaushalya Karnataka Yojane (CMKKY) accredited training center for two courses, viz., Fitter mechanical assembly and PCB assembly operator. The training course is commencing shortly.





- 6. Association with other organizations
- a) GIZ: We continued our association with GIZ and got an opportunity to participate in the Train the Trainer program. An employee from the Cluster was nominated for this program.



In association with BCIC and GIZ, ELCIA conducted an online session on the advantages of apprenticeship and the process to be followed. Officials from GoK and Mr. Hegde spoke in the session.

A best practice sharing session was conducted among all the associations associated with GIZ. This session provided an insight into the operations of the Aurangabad technical center.

- b) Wadhwani Group: A new digital platform called GENIE was launched by Wadhawani Group that helps SMEs in their growth aspirations. ELCIA recommended this structured data-driven program which conducts a detailed assessment of the SME's current business and offers solutions to grow. It would directly and deeply engage with SMEs to identify solutions that will help them become more efficient and grow.

- c) The GAIN: We got associated with The GAIN for three objectives:
- i. To foster collaborations between the ELCIA and GAIN to support the start-ups through structured programs in the selected domain.
- **ii.** To provide infrastructure, business counseling, and mentorship to help the start-ups to scale up their business.



10. E-City Police Station rental issue: ELCIA had


played an enabler / catalyst role to get Police Stations operate out of Electronics City (both Law & order and Traffic). To enable the same ELCIA had paid lease rentals for the two properties in 08-02-2012. Post this period, KSSIDC had treated this as a Leased premises and continued to charge along with interests and penalties. A total amount of Rs. 1.24 Cr was demanded by KSSSIDC. Mr. Seetharam President & Mr. Vaidyanathan Jt. Secy along with representatives from Police Station, met with KSSIDC team including their Managing Director Mr. Mahesh B. Shirur. They emphasised that ELCIA had not sought to buy the two flats, but were enabler for a 'Civic Service' such as a Police Station. They also pointed out that both KSSIDC and Police being different arms of Government, should review the entire matter in this perspective and sort out internally between the two arms of GOK. The appeal / plea by ELCIA was heard favourably and KSSIDC agreed that they would take up with Police department and sort out the matter.



11. ELCIA is not just an association working towards empowering its member organization businesses but also an employee's association that tries to address their needs also. Few programs conducted under this heading are



- a) ELCIA Knowledge Club: Technology and business are both constantly evolving. To keep our skill sets and experiences relevant, we must regularly reskill. Many companies in Electronics City have knowledge and skills in a wide range of industries, which could be very valuable. Why don't we share what we've learned? ELCIA, with the help of volunteers of companies in Electronics City, launched a master class series - 'Knowledge Club' - for enhancing employees' skills for their career growth. "We request our members to share this information with their staff and encourage them to register on the site by sharing an intriguing topic to learn about."
- b) Independence day quiz: To celebrate our country's 75th Independence Day, we organized an online quiz on the ELCIA website. One of the goals of the exercise was to drive traffic to the new ELCIA website. The quiz was organized for five days, from 10th August to 14th August, and we are happy to say that we received a good response. Many prizes were given away.





c) Jana Aushalaya: A generic medicine distribution counter is being set up in the ELCIA complex to benefit Electronics City's large employee population.



Notes to Accounts for the year ended 31st March 2021

1. Significant Accounting Policies

These accounts are prepared under the historical cost basis of accounting and evaluated on a going concern basis. The significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the Financial Statements are:

- a) Revenue is recognized on accrual basis except
 - Maintenance fees from members in respect of closed units is recognized as income on cash basis with effect from 01.04.2005.
 - ii. Maintenance Fee is a voluntary contribution from members and is recognized on accrual basis only if there is a firm commitment from the contributing members and a reasonable certainty of collection.
- iii. Membership Annual Subscription Fee Membership fee is being accounted as per the bylaws of the Association.
- b) Fixed assets are stated at cost of acquisition less depreciation.
- c) Depreciation on fixed assets has been charged on written down value method, by adopting the rates of depreciation specified in the Income Tax Act 1961.
- d) A provision is recognized if, as a result of a past event, the association has a present obligation that can be estimated reliably, and it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation. Provisions are recognized at the best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the balance sheet date.
- e) The presentation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known materialized.
- 2. In the opinion of the Executive Committee, the value on realization of current assets, loans & advances will, in the ordinary course of business, not be less than the amount at which they are stated in the Balance Sheet.
- 3. The total building corpus fund outstanding as at March 31, 2021 was Rs. 4,64,92,724 which includes transfer from Road Naming & Maintenance Fund of Rs. 2,22,25,923.
- 4. Land amounting to Rs. 2,38,23,463 in Schedule No 5 (Fixed Assets) includes leasehold land of Rs. 2,15,02,985 pursuant to the lease cum sale agreement dated May 16, 2011 with Karnataka State Electronics Development Corporation Limited. The lease period is for 10 years.



5. Contingent Liabilities

Income Tax:

i) During the year 2013-14, consequent to completion of Income Tax assessment for the Assessment Year 2011-12, ELCIA received a notice for a claim of Rs. 76,75,438 which includes reversal of the refund already granted for AY – 2011-12 u/s 143(1)(A) of Rs. 33,80,270 and Interest of Rs. 2,19,713 on that refund from 31-03-2013 to 17-03-2014. ELCIA had filed an appeal with the Commissioner of Income Tax Appeals – V. ELCIA had paid Rs. 25 Lacs under protest. Commissioner of Income Tax Appeals held that ELCIA is not eligible for exemption u/s 11 of the Income Tax Act, 1961 and hence its income would be taxed accordingly, after considering the accretion and application of funds which was earlier ignored by the Assessing Officer. Appeal to the Income Tax Appellate Tribunal (ITAT) has been filed on the 29th day of March 2016. Consequent to the order received from the Commissioner of Income Tax Appeals (CIT Appeals), the case had been put forth to Appellate Tribunal for consideration.

The ITAT vide order pronounced on 21st February, 2018 quashed the order of the CIT Appeals and passed an order in favour of ELCIA directing the Assessing Officer to examine and verify whether the assessee satisfies the provisions of Sec. 11 only so far as the application of income is concerned for availing exemption under Section 11 of the Act to which it is otherwise entitled.

CIT Appeals, on 29th June 2018, filed an appeal with the Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka vide Case No. 464/2018 against the order passed by the ITAT. We were informed by ELCIA that the case got dismissed by Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka on 16th January 2020. ELCIA is yet to receive the Judgement of the same.

ii a) During the year 2014-15, consequent to completion of Income Tax assessment for the Assessment Year 2012-13, ELCIA received a notice for a claim of Rs. 1,52,42,617 which includes reversal of the refund already granted for AY – 2012-13 u/s 143(1)(A) of Rs. 17,76,560. ELCIA has filed an appeal with the Commissioner of Income Tax Appeals – V. ELCIA has paid Rs. 40 Lacs under protest. Matter is still pending with CIT appeals.

ELCIA has been advised by their tax consultants that they have strong grounds for the above appeal and hence the aforesaid amount of Rs. 1,52,42,617 for AY 2012-13 have not been provided in the income and expenditure account especially in the light of ITAT passing order in favour of ELCIA for AY 2011-12

- **ii b)** Consequent to completion of Income Tax assessment for the Assessment Year 2013-14, ELCIA had received a notice for a claim of Rs. 95,82,313. ELCIA has filed an appeal with the Commissioner of Income Tax Appeals. Matter is still pending with CIT appeals. During the Year 2019-20 ELCIA has received demand Notice from Tax Recovery Officer (Exemptions) for the same case and ELCIA paid 19,16,500 being 20% of tax demand under protest.
- ii c) During the year 2016-17, consequent to completion of Income Tax assessment for the Assessment Year 2014-15, ELCIA received a notice for a claim of Rs. 27,63,452. ELCIA has filed an appeal with the Commissioner of Income Tax Appeals. Matter is still pending before CIT appeals. During the Year 2018-19 ELCIA has received demand Notice from Tax Recovery Officer (Exemptions) for the same case for Rs.27,63,452 and interest of Rs. 6,07,959. ELCIA has paid Rs.5,52,890 being 20% of tax demanded under protest as on 24th July 2019.

We were informed by ELCIA that in the above three cases Tax Consultants of ELCIA had appeared before the CIT Appeals. During the hearing it was brought to the notice whether ELCIA wants to avail the scheme of Vivad Se Vishwas. ELCIA argued that since ITAT Order is in ELCIA's favour the case shall be disposed in favour of ELCIA. We were told that after that hearing no further notices were issued, and the matter is still pending before CIT appeals

Service Tax:

i) ELCIA has been availing services from CISF till October 2013 for the benefit of members and protection of estate property in Electronic City. CISF has received a notice from Service Tax department for the period financial year 2007 till 2011 on the grounds that, CISF has not billed ELCIA for service tax. CISF has contended that, they are an exempt entity and hence not required to bill service tax. CISF has filed an appeal with the Service Tax department. In the event service tax department passes an order against CISF, CISF may pass-on the liability to ELCIA. The demand raised by the service tax department is Rs. 76,67,875 along with interest and penalty. The matter is pending.

ELCIA has been advised by their consultants that, there is no liability in view of the aforesaid matter and hence, no provision has been made in the books of accounts.

- ii) As per the assessment order issued on March 2, 2018 the Commissioner of Central Tax had raised a demand for service tax amounting to Rs.56,19,984 for the period April 2007 to March 2011 with interest and penalty. ELCIA has gone on appeal and has been advised by their consultants that as the matter is under appeal and the liability has not been crystallized, no provision has been made in the books of accounts.
- iii) The Commissioner has passed assessment order relating to short payment of service tax w.r.t Renting of Immovable Property Service and Clubs or Association Service for the period 2006-07 and 2009-10. The order dated 15.06.2016 confirmed the demand of Rs.7,86,074/- for the period 2009-10 and Rs.29,22,154/- for the period 2006-07 along with interest under section 75 and imposed penalty of Rs.7,86,074/- & Rs.29,22,154/- under section 78 and Rs.10,000/- each under section 77(1)(a) & 77(2) of Finance Act, 1994.

ELCIA has filed an appeal with Hon'ble Customs, Excise & Service Tax Appellate Tribunal (CESTAT) on the aforesaid demand and presently the same is pending before Hon'ble CESTAT for final hearing.

6. Police Station arrear Rent

We were informed that, in 2006 ELCIA had taken a flat (No. A 101, Block 1) at KSSIDC complex on rent from Karnataka State Small Industries Development Corporation Ltd with the objective to establish Law and Order Police Station at Electronic city. ELCIA had transferred the said flat to Police station and have been paying rent to KSSIDC until 2012. KSSIDC has now demanding arrear rent amounting to Rs.55,87,753 up to period 31.10.2019

Further to the above, from 2015, Police station had started using Flat B-102, Block 1 for storing seized furniture and Equipment. According to KSSIDC Police had not vacated the premises even after sending several notices. KSSIDC has raised a demand for Rs.14,35,305 as arrear rent up to







period 31.10.2019

Further, ELCIA had taken Flat No. A 213 from 01.04.2010 on rent with the objective to establish Traffic Police Station. KSSIDC has raised a demand for Rs.55,39,087 as arrear rent up to period 31.10.2019

Total arrear rent demanded by KSSIDC for the above 3 flats up to period 31-10-2019 is Rs.125,62,145. As at 31-03-2021 ELCIA has provided Rs.76,90,688 towards police station rent in its books. We were informed that discussions are on between ELCIA, Police Station and KSSIDC to resolve the issue.

- 7. Electronics City Industries' Association has been granted the status of Charitable Institution under section 12A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 with effect from April 1st, 2006 as a 'Wholly Charitable Society '. The continuance of this status has been rejected by the Income Tax Department in the tax assessment for AY 2011-12 and for AY 2012-13 as stated in note 5 above. With respect to AY 2011-12 ITAT has quashed the order of the CIT Appeals and passed an order in favour of ELCIA. For the AY 2012-13 the matter is still pending with CIT Appeals. Hence, no provision for income tax has been made during the year.
- 8. Previous years' figures have been re-grouped and re-arranged wherever necessary.

ELCIA Trust Chairman's Note



2020-21 has been an unprecedented year for the world and all of us have experienced trauma and health scare for ourselves and people close to us. It was also an extraordinary year for ELCIA Trust when there was major shift in focus to healthcare from education. With schools closed and people scrambling for hospital beds and heath care, ELCIA Trust along with ELCIA and ELCITA decided to provide health care infrastructure to needy hospitals. In addition, similar to Covid 19 1st wave, food and food grains were distributed to those who were out of jobs and did not have access to food.

Humanity was at its peak and benevolent donor companies, individuals, employees contributed significantly to Trust and also made direct donations to beneficiaries identified by ELCIA Trust. It all started with donation of oxygen concentrator and thereafter, 11:00 AM meetings for 45 days. It was a great team work and each of the members took responsibility for various activities like collection of funds, procurement of equipment, preparing MoUs and handing over the equipment on time.

An organization which had an annual spend of around Rs 1.5 Crore, facilitated donations worth close to Rs 5 Crores speaks volumes about the passion and speed with which the team worked and flow of funds from benevolent donors. This is an example of a self-driven team reaching goal way beyond their own imagination. Equipment for 15 ICUs was made available to hospital within 15 days with the sponsorship of Infosys and ELCITA. 6 ventilators were distributed to hospitals and 83 concentrators were procured despite import issues. Momentive, Fanuc India and Tessolve contributed for ventilators. Moog controls, Synthesis and many other companies and individuals contributed for oxygen concentrators. Donation of Oxygen generators donations by Walvoil was facilitated by Mr Vaidyanathan. Wipro and ELCIA sponsored the ration kits while companies and individuals donated for food packets. The team members also helped many patients in getting hospital beds, medicines and healthcare to desperate patients

While these activities were driven by the need of the hour, our children in Govt schools were not privileged to attend on line classes like children in private schools. ELCIA Trust along with Aurigine provided about 90 children with smart phones so that they can be participate in on line sessions. On line sessions were conducted by volunteers from ELCIA and Infosys which brought cheer to Govt school kids.

Believe me armed with this experience, I am confident that ELCIA Trust is capable of taking up much bigger goals and spreading its wings beyond education. As I see, there are many areas including healthcare, lake rejuvenation and waste management



in villages in addition to education require our attention and intervention. We have many companies who are already engaged in CSR activities in a big way and here is my request to utilize ELCIA Trust with 20 years' experience and practically no administrative overheads to channelize some of your CSR funds. As you are aware lake rejuvenation requires huge funds which is possible if all of us come together and take it up on war footing. This will go a long way in creating clean water sources and healthy living. I envision Trust to grow to Rs 25 Crore by its silver jubilee year and be a social entity of national reconning.

I would like to thank ELCIA Trust Trustees, Mr Vaidyanathan, ELCIA and ELCITA staff for their excellent team work and contribution in combating Covid 19. A big salute to all the sponsors and donors who contributed generously to the cause

ELCIA Trust Activities

Covid Initiatives



The year 2020-21 was a milestone year for many reasons. There were many challenges and opportunities, but ELCIA Trust was able to provide succor and support in many instances. During this period, we undertook a number of initiatives that made citizens' life easier.

Pandemic has made our heart melt for our family, employees and community. In this hour of mayhem, we had to hold each other's hands and support ourselves to tide over the crisis. In 2020 ELCIA Trust focused on providing food for migrant workers by distributing 1,50,000 lunch packets and 6500 ration kits. This year there was an urgent need for strengthening health care to reduce the pressure on the system.

ELCIA Trust decided to focus on health care as the situation was getting out of hands with people getting desperate for hospital beds and healthcare.



ELCIA Trust set out to make a difference by augmenting healthcare facilities in hospitals:

- Treatment capacity enhancement in Different Hospitals (ICU facilities / Ventilators etc.,)
- Oxygen Generator plant supplies
- Oxygen Concentrators for distribution to hospitals and the needy
- Opex support to Charitable hospital(s)
- Food packets and ration kits distribution to the needy

An appeal was made by Chairman, ELCIA Trust which received an overwhelming response from companies and individuals including friends of Office Bearers. The record collections / support was effectively channelized for the above causes through a four-pronged strategy,

- ELCIA Trust using the collected money to buy equipment as suggested by the donor
- Donors sponsoring equipment and ELCIA Trust facilitating the donor beneficiary connect
- ELCIA Trust enabling Opex Support for a needy Hospital
- ELCIA using collection to donate equipment, food, ration kits to needy

Creation of 15 bed ICU at Kauvery Hospital Electronics City

During the pandemic, one of the things that came to the fore was the severe lack of critical medical equipment, including oxygen generators, oxygen concentrators, and life-saving medicines. Realizing that the government's hands were stretched and something had to be done on a war footing, ELCITA and Infosys partnered to sponsor medical equipment for **15 ICU** beds in Kauvery Hospital, costing **1.4 crores**. We are also actively helping citizens get access to these beds, and this initiative has already saved many lives.









Oxygen generators to Kauvery

Two oxygen generators costing Rs 50L each sponsored by Walvoil and Timken are being given to hospitals. One given to Kauvery is already functioning, and their dependency on oxygen cylinders has come down.





Oxygen Bank

Eighty -Seven oxygen concentrators have been procured from the donations received, in which 72 concentrators of cost 80 Lakhs are available in the Oxygen bank for donation to Hospitals and for the needy people to lend it for free of cost. The procedure to engage these oxygen concentrators for personal use is published on the ELCIA Trust website.

Food distribution

The pandemic has hit the citizenry very severely. The most affected were the citizens living below the poverty line, many of whom, having lost their jobs, could not arrange even food for their families. As it is said in India, 'Anna Daanam Mahaa Daanam' (offering food is the best form of seva in the world). ELCIA Trust has always been at the forefront when it comes to improving citizens' lives, and during this pandemic, too, we did not flinch from doing our duty.

We began distributing food packets on 11th May 2021, with the help of **30 volunteers** around Electronics City, and as of today, we have distributed lunch packs total of **30,000**. The areas covered for food distribution are Pragathinagar, Singasandra Govt hospital, Bettadasanapura, Chikktoguru village, Vittasandra, Vaddarapalya, Manjunatha layout, GS Palya, Gowtham Nagar, and Konappana Agrahara. Elcia Trust distributed **2335** ration kits to the needy out of **1735** ration kits donated by Wipro Limited.





Vaccination drive

In the early phases of the pandemic, there was a severe shortage of vaccines, and most citizens couldn't access them. ELCIA Trust came forward at this crucial juncture and in partnership with the government of Karnataka and private hospitals, facilitated Covid-19 vaccines.









Donation of 95 mobiles and Online classes for 7th std students from 4 Govt school

During the pandemic, most schools and colleges closed down, and classes moved to the virtual platform. However, many students were unable to access the classes because they didn't have the equipment, the very least of which is a smartphone. Realizing this need, Aurigene and ELCIA Trust donated 65 and 30 smartphones, respectively to poor and meritorious students studying in government colleges in and around Electronics

City.





Vidya Nidhi Scholarship to 80 students

Financial Assistance and career counselling were provided to 80 meritorious students after their 10th. These Vidya Nidhi scholarships are expected to lessen the financial burden on these students and help them concentrate on their studies.







Solid waste segregation

Solid waste is a major issue across the world, and there are no easy solutions to waste management. To increase awareness about solid waste management, a solid waste segregation session was conducted in Singasandra Govt school, ensuring proper Covid protocol. The students and teachers were provided information on the need for solid waste management and what they could do to ensure solid waste is reduced/ segregated at source.





Interschool science fair

To increase students' interest in science and technology careers and to plant a spark for the love of Science in them, ELCIA Trust organized an interschool science fair to Konappana Agrahara, Thimaiah Reddy and Hebbagodi schools, at Ananthanagar school.







Crash courses for high schools

A crash course in the final months of exam preparation was conducted to refresh students' memories of subjects they have studied while also acting as a marks booster. Faculty from Ananthnagar School was facilitated to conduct a crash course for 10th std students of Thimaiah Reddy High school.



Donation of 30 refurbished systems

Computer education is a necessity today because many vocations are computer-based. Having computer knowledge gives one an edge in the job market. Electronics City is fortunate to have many businesses in its midst who are socially conscious and willing to go the extra mile to help citizens to realize a better standard of living, especially in education.

For instance, ELCIA Trust recently donated 30 refurbished computer systems (sponsored by Aurigene) to 3 different schools (10 each), including Police Public School, Koramangala. We expect that these schools will use these systems to provide a better quality of education to their students.







Classroom Inauguration

Good infrastructure is a necessity for learning, and it is often seen that it affects the quality of learning outcomes. Understanding this reality, ELCIA trust recently renovated two classrooms in Thirupalya and Gollahalli government schools, both of which were funded by MOOG Controls.
