

Secretary's Report – For the Year 2025–26

It is my privilege, on behalf of the Executive Committee, to present the Secretary's Report for the year 2025–26.

This year has been one of **purposeful progress** for ELCIA. We remained focused on creating value for our members through advocacy, capability building, partnerships, business networking, and community activities.

Member engagement continued to be our core strength. Through Leaders' Connect meetings, networking sessions, workshops, and regular interactions, we stayed closely connected with industry needs and worked collectively on emerging opportunities and challenges.

We also maintained active engagement with Government departments on infrastructure, mobility, utilities, competitiveness, and ease of doing business.

The **ELCIA Cluster** continued to support MSMEs through advanced testing facilities, engineering services, and technical collaborations.

A key milestone was the progress towards establishing the **Centre of Excellence for Sensors**, aimed at positioning Electronics City as a national hub for sensor technologies, product innovation, and advanced manufacturing.

The **ELCIA Skills Development Centre** also made strong progress. More than 1,100 industry professionals were reskilled and upskilled through over 30 workshops, and more than 800 students were facilitated into apprenticeships and employment with member companies.

ELCIA **hosted delegations** from Japan, South Korea, Germany, Russia, and other countries, opening avenues for technology exchange, investment discussions, and member collaboration.

We **organised and partnered in major programmes** including the Electronics Tech Summit, Supercomputing India Conference, industry roundtables, technical seminars, workshops, and networking events.

Participation at Electronica and Productronica India 2026 also gave member companies an important platform to showcase capabilities and strengthen outreach.

On policy advocacy, ELCIA actively represented member interests on industrial infrastructure, logistics, public transport, utilities, incentives, workforce development, and sector-focused initiatives.

Beyond industry, ELCIA Trust continued **community initiatives** through ELCIA Trust, while ELCITA maintained infrastructure that stands as a model for urban self-governance.

Looking ahead, our priorities are clear: advance the Centre of Excellence for Sensors, expand skilling, strengthen member services, deepen industry–Government collaboration, and enhance Electronics City’s position as India’s premier electronics and technology manufacturing destination.

Before I conclude, I sincerely thank our President, Executive Committee Members, Past Presidents, Trustees, ELCITA Board, ELCIA Trust, CEO and Secretariat, member companies, Government departments, and partners for their support throughout the year.
